

About The Madrichim Fellowship

What is the Madrichim Fellowship?

The Madrichim Fellowship is our newest fellowship opportunity for rising 8th and 9th graders. Designed to train teen teaching assistants to be more effective supporters and advocates in the classroom and create a more inclusive world outside of it. Fellows will become familiar with the tools needed to build inclusive environments, and the leadership skills to apply these tools. The fellowship will culminate in a teen designed project that reflects their individual interests and is valuable in your community setting. The Madrichim Fellowship is facilitated and planned in partnership with the Association of Reform Jewish Educators (ARJE).

Who should be in the Madrichim Fellowship?

We are looking for talented, enthusiastic early teens in 8-9 grade who are serving as madrichim in URJ congregations or ARJE member communities and interested in learning more about inclusion and belonging. These teens are interested in gaining the skills to be advocates and community builders. Teens who are ready to grow, learn, and take on a little bit of leadership make excellent fellows.

What will teens do in the Madrichim Fellowship?

Participants will explore issues around inclusion, advocacy, and community building in their monthly zoom sessions. They will engage with ARJE members and education champions around North America. Guided by a mentor, they will plan a project to make positive change in their community setting.

What is the time commitment?

The Madrichim Fellowship will meet once monthly on Sunday late afternoons/evenings from October through March, for six 60-75 minute sessions. There may be small tasks that fellows will be expected to complete between sessions, as well as a final inclusion or advocacy project on a timeline picked by each fellow.

When do applications for the Madrichim Fellowship close?

Applications for the fellowship open in August and will close on Sunday, September 30. We also encourage you to nominate any teens who you think would be a good fit. The nomination and interest form can be found on [NFTY.org/Nominate](https://www.nfty.org/Nominate).

- Encourage peer-to-peer engagement among the teens you engage with to help spread the word so they can participate with their friends.
- When posting on social media, make sure there's a way to access the application link, i.e. using a linktree in the bio of your Instagram profile.
- Consider those in your network who are teen-adjacent and share fellowship information with them as well (i.e. front desk staff, parents of teens, clergy, camp staff, etc.).
- You know your teens/community best! Our toolkit is intended to make promotion as easy as possible, but we trust your discretion with the language that feels most authentic and appropriate for your community.
