Our field is dominated by women. Older studies once claimed that women were less likely than men to ask for raises—but recent research has flipped that narrative. Women do ask for raises just as often; they're just less likely to *get them*. When we contribute accurate, detailed salary data, we empower ourselves and our peers with the information needed to advocate effectively.

As an educators, we know that salaries are only meaningful when compared across truly comparable roles. An ARJE member in Manhattan has a very different cost of living and salary scale than one in Detroit or Denver. That's why we need **as many educators as possible**—from every region, role, and type of organization—to fill out the survey. More participation means more robust data that can help each of us see the full picture.

We're also facing a growing challenge: **young professionals are leaving—or never entering—Jewish education** because of its reputation for lower salaries. By sharing and spreading access to reliable salary data, we can help change that narrative. Transparency empowers early-career educators to advocate for themselves, negotiate fair compensation, and stay in this sacred work.

And let's be honest—many of our organizations and synagogues simply don't have the infrastructure to develop comprehensive salary bands or benefits frameworks. By filling out this survey, we're not only helping ourselves—we're helping *them* help *us*. The more information available, the easier it is for leadership to make informed, equitable offers and create sustainable career pathways.
