- Teaching and engaging students in grades K-9 each day
- Ongoing evaluation of student achievement
- Regular communication with parents
- Family programming and parent education
- Home and internet-based learning initiatives
- Ongoing engagement with staff and congregants to foster a greater sense of Jewish community
- Support outside the classroom activities including but not limited to:
  - 5-7 grade “J-Lectives” that happen throughout the year
  - Special programs for our 8-12 grade team
  - Special programs in our lower school throughout the year
- Offer administrative and curricular support to one of our key subject areas ranging from:
  - Israel
  - Art
  - Music
  - Technology
  - Hebrew/Prayer
